

Rule #1: All applicants must be a direct relative of a 774th TAS Association (hereafter Association) member. Direct relatives are defined as siblings, children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, grand-nieces, or grand-nephews for the purposes of this scholarship.

Rule #2: All applicants must be a senior in high school and have applied to and been accepted at an accredited college or university;  
or be an undergraduate of an accredited college or university with at least one full semester remaining after award of the scholarship.

Rule #3: All applicants must be citizens of the United States of America, including its possessions.

Rule #4: All applications must be received by the Association Scholarship Committee by the date published on the appropriate official entry form for the Association Reunion. Normally, the date will be set approximately 45 days prior to a reunion. The scholarship is normally to be awarded in conjunction with a (currently biennial) Association Reunion.

Rule #5: All materials, creations, concepts, likenesses, designs, ideas, and intellectual rights and properties used, mentioned, spoken and written in association with the entry form by the entrant are the property of the 774th TAS Association.

Rule #6: Determination of the winner by the Association Scholarship committee, after approval by the 774 TAS Association Board of Directors, is final.

Rule #7: Void where prohibited by law; application and award process is governed by U.S. law and is subject to all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations.

Rule #8: One application per entrant. Any applicant found to have entered more than once per year, under different identities, for the Scholarship, will be permanently disqualified from application for the scholarship.

Rule #9: All information on the application must be accurate, complete, and original work. Personal references must be authentic. Plagiarism of any form will be grounds for disqualification.

Rule #10: Applicants agree that the Association and any officers, affiliates, contractors or their employees shall not be held liable for any injury, loss, or damage of any kind resulting from participation in this scholarship competition.

Rule #11: The amount of the scholarship is subject to available funds of the Association; normally one scholarship in the range of \$500 to \$1000 will be awarded in conjunction with each biennial Association reunion.

Policy #1: If the award of the scholarship is to be during the Saturday banquet of a biennial reunion, the winner is encouraged to be present for the award of this scholarship. A family member is allowed to accept if attendance places an undue hardship on the winner of the Scholarship.
